An affidavit having been filed in this case by Christian Kings an inquest was this day held in and form of law concerning the alleged insanity of John Kings and from the testimony of several witnesses one of whom is a respectable Physician the Court do find that the said John Kings is insane, that his insanity is of long than ten years duration, that he is not subject to epilepsy, that he has a legal settlement in County Township in this County, and is a citizen of the State of Ohio, and that he is a proper person to be sent to the Asylum for the Insane to undergo treatment therein. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said John Kings be confined in the Asylum of this County to await his admission into the Asylum aforesaid.
